HOW TO USE THE NUMBER

Subtract the lower-rated team from the higher-rated team to establish a neutral-ice baseline. Then adjust for the confirmed starting goalies, home ice, injuries, rest and travel. A five-point difference or greater deserves closer review, but the market price still determines whether the game is playable.

POWER PLAY EXAMPLE

Colorado 97 vs. Los Angeles 79 creates an 18-point raw gap. That is not an automatic bet: downgrade Colorado for a backup goalie or poor rest, add home ice where appropriate, then compare the adjusted projection with the available moneyline.

ATLANTIC DIVISION

Buffalo Sabres

OUTLOOK: Buffalo returns a talented young core after winning 50 games, but Tuch's 33 goals and leadership leave a substantial hole.

KEY TO SUCCESS: Tage Thompson, Rasmus Dahlin and Owen Power must lead, while Zellweger helps replace Byram's puck movement. The power play must improve from last season's 19.5%. Buffalo offseason report

Boston Bruins

SUBTRACTIONS: F Viktor Arvidsson, G Joonas Korpisalo, D Andrew Peeke

OUTLOOK: Peterka gives David Pastrnak another legitimate scoring option, while Boston reinforced its defense.

KEY TO SUCCESS: Jeremy Swayman must remain a high-end goalie, and Boston needs better production down the middle. Peterka succeeding beside Pastrnak would transform the offense. Boston offseason report

Detroit Red Wings

SUBTRACTIONS: F Patrick Kane, F James van Riemsdyk, G Cam Talbot

OUTLOOK: Arvidsson adds needed scoring, but Detroit still enters the season with questions about its overall direction and offensive ceiling.

KEY TO SUCCESS: Dylan Larkin must remain productive and engaged, while John Gibson supplies dependable goaltending. Detroit ranked only 22nd in scoring last season.

Florida Panthers

ADDITIONS: F Brady Tkachuk, G Jacob Markstrom, G Akira Schmid, D Radko Gudas

SUBTRACTIONS: G Sergei Bobrovsky, F Evan Rodrigues, F Jesper Boqvist

OUTLOOK: Florida missed the playoffs amid major injuries, but a healthy Aleksander Barkov and the addition of Brady Tkachuk make its forward group extremely difficult to handle.

KEY TO SUCCESS: Markstrom must rebound from an .883 save percentage, and Barkov and Matthew Tkachuk must remain healthy. Florida's skaters are championship caliber; goaltending is the variable. Florida outlook

Montreal Canadiens

SUBTRACTIONS: F Brendan Gallagher, F Patrik Laine, F Joe Veleno

OUTLOOK: Montreal reached the Eastern Conference Final and returns an ascending young core led by Nick Suzuki.

KEY TO SUCCESS: The Canadiens need continued development from their young forwards and more responsibility from G Jacob Fowler and D David Reinbacher. Avoiding regression after last spring's run will be critical.

Ottawa Senators

Toronto Maple Leafs

METROPOLITAN DIVISION

Carolina Hurricanes

SUBTRACTIONS: G Frederik Andersen

OUTLOOK: The defending champions return almost the entire group that went 16-3 during the postseason.

KEY TO SUCCESS: Maintain their territorial and shot-suppression advantages while receiving adequate goaltending following Andersen's departure.

Washington Capitals

KEY TO SUCCESS: Keep Robertson fully engaged, receive dependable goaltending from Jake Oettinger and get more playoff production from the top forwards.

Utah Mammoth

KEY TO SUCCESS: Juuse Saros must remain excellent, and the new forwards must create more balanced scoring around Steven Stamkos and Filip Forsberg.

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CENTRAL DIVISION

Winnipeg Jets

MAJOR UNCERTAINTY: G Connor Hellebuyck requested a trade but remained on the roster entering September

OUTLOOK: Winnipeg's entire projection changes if Hellebuyck is traded.

KEY TO SUCCESS: Resolve the goaltending uncertainty and receive better defensive play in front of either Hellebuyck or Skinner.

Chicago Blackhawks

KEY TO SUCCESS: Andersen must remain healthy and solve the goaltending problem. Edmonton also must compensate for Nurse's minutes on defense.

Vegas Golden Knights

KEY TO SUCCESS: Craig must establish continuity quickly, while Jack Eichel and Mark Stone remain healthy.

KEY TO SUCCESS: Re-sign and maximize Cutter Gauthier, protect Lukas Dostal and survive Troy Terry's early absence. Anaheim offseason report

SUBTRACTION: F Jeff Malott

OUTLOOK: The veteran additions make Los Angeles deeper, but also one of the NHL's oldest teams.

KEY TO SUCCESS: Peter Laviolette must create more playoff offense and manage the veterans' workloads throughout the 84-game schedule.

San Jose Sharks

SUBTRACTION: F William Eklund

OUTLOOK: San Jose greatly upgraded its physical presence and experience, although losing Eklund removes a skilled young forward.

KEY TO SUCCESS: Macklin Celebrini must take another step toward superstardom, and the reconstructed defense must improve puck possession rather than merely add size.

Calgary Flames

SUBTRACTIONS: Continued veteran turnover associated with the rebuild

OUTLOOK: Calgary is assembling a younger defense around goaltender Dustin Wolf but remains short on high-end scoring.

KEY TO SUCCESS: Wolf must perform at a high level and Nemec must develop into a top-pair defenseman.

Seattle Kraken

SUBTRACTIONS: F Jaden Schwartz, F Andre Burakovsky

OUTLOOK: Samoskevich brings speed and breakout potential, but Seattle still lacks proven elite offensive talent.

KEY TO SUCCESS: Obtain major development from younger forwards and receive consistent goaltending from Joey Daccord.

Vancouver Canucks

SUBTRACTION: D Quinn Hughes, traded during the previous season

OUTLOOK: Vancouver has entered a rebuilding period following the loss of its franchise defenseman.

KEY TO SUCCESS: Elias Pettersson must rebound, the new coaching staff must establish structure and the Canucks need young players acquired in the Hughes transaction to develop quickly.




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Best Tips and Options for Betting Hockey

Hockey offers bettors more choices than simply picking which team will win. Moneylines, puck lines, totals and individual-period wagers each provide a different way to attack a matchup. The best option depends on what your handicap says about the game.

Before making any hockey wager, confirm the starting goalies, review injuries and line combinations, compare five-on-five performance, and account for rest and travel. Most importantly, determine whether the available odds offer value. Picking the likely winner is not enough if the price is too expensive.

MONEYLINE

A full-game moneyline is generally the best starting point for inexperienced hockey bettors. You are betting on which team will win, and most NHL moneylines include overtime and the shootout.

MONEYLINES ARE MOST ATTRACTIVE WHEN:

- An underdog has the better starting goalie.
- A rested team faces an opponent playing on consecutive nights.
- The market is overvaluing a favorite because of reputation or a recent winning streak.
- Your calculated win probability is meaningfully higher than the probability implied by the odds.

For example, a team priced at +130 needs to win approximately 43.5% of the time to break even. If your handicap gives that team a 48% chance, the moneyline may offer value.

Be careful about routinely laying -180 or higher. Expensive favorites must win at a very high rate just to overcome an occasional upset.

PUCK LINE

The standard puck line is hockey's version of a point spread: Favorite -1.5 goals; Underdog +1.5 goals.

Betting a favorite -1.5 produces a better return than laying its moneyline, but the team must win by at least two goals. A favorite can dominate the game, win 3-2 and still fail to cover.

THE -1.5 PUCK LINE WORKS BEST WHEN:

- The favorite has a large five-on-five advantage.
- The underdog is starting a weak or inexperienced goalie.
- One team has a significant rest or travel disadvantage.
- The favorite is likely to control the game and create an empty-net opportunity.

The +1.5 puck line is useful when an underdog has strong goaltending and frequently plays close, low-scoring games. However, the price is often expensive. A bettor should not automatically take +1.5 simply for protection.

Empty-net goals are extremely important to puck-line betting. A one-goal game can become a two-goal result in the final minute, helping the favorite cover -1.5 while defeating an underdog ticket that appeared secure.

FULL-GAME TOTALS

Hockey totals commonly ask whether the teams will combine to score over or under a posted number. The handicap should begin with the confirmed goalies, but it should also include:

- Five-on-five expected goals
- High-danger scoring chances
- Shot volume and shot quality
- Power-play production
- Penalty-kill performance
- Team penalty rates
- Rest and travel
- Defensive injuries
- Expected game pace

An over becomes more attractive when both teams generate quality chances, take frequent penalties or have questionable goaltending. An under becomes more attractive when both teams defend the slot well, play at a controlled pace and have reliable starting goalies.

Avoid making a totals bet based entirely on recent final scores. A team may have played several overs because of an unsustainably high shooting percentage, poor backup goaltending or empty-net goals.

Full-game totals can include overtime and a shootout settlement goal, depending on the sportsbook's rules. Always verify how the book grades the market.

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Betting on Hockey: Periods

FIRST-PERIOD BETTING

The first period is usually the most useful individual-period market before the game begins. Bettors can wager on:

- First-period moneyline
- First-period three-way result, including the tie
- First-period puck line
- First-period total
- Either team to score
- Both teams to score
- No goal or first team to score

First-period wagers are most effective when a team consistently starts quickly or slowly and the reason is supported by more than a small trend.

- Teams playing their first home game after a long road trip
- Tired teams starting a backup goalie
- Strong home teams that apply immediate offensive pressure
- Teams that frequently score first
- Starting goalies with poor opening-period numbers
- Matchups between aggressive forechecking teams
- Teams coming off emotional or physically demanding games

A first-period under can be attractive when both teams begin cautiously, defend well and have strong goaltending. A first-period over may offer value when both teams start aggressively, allow early high-danger chances or possess strong power plays against poor penalty kills.

The advantage of first-period betting is that it avoids later empty-net goals. The disadvantage is the smaller sample: one deflection, penalty or goaltending mistake can decide the entire wager.

SECOND-PERIOD BETTING

The second period can produce more open play because teams have the "long change," meaning their defensive players must travel farther to reach the bench. This can create extended offensive-zone possessions, tired defenders and poor line changes.

SECOND-PERIOD OVERS CAN BE ATTRACTIVE WHEN:

- Both teams play at a fast pace.
- Defenses struggle with line changes.
- The first period was active but produced fewer goals than the chances suggested.
- Either team takes frequent penalties.
- A trailing team must become more aggressive.

Second-period moneylines require more caution before the game because the market depends heavily on what happens in the opening period. These markets are often better suited to live betting.

A scoreless first period does not automatically make the second-period over valuable. Determine whether the game was genuinely quiet or whether the goalies simply stopped several excellent chances.

THIRD-PERIOD BETTING

The third period is the most situational and volatile period to handicap. The score after two periods dramatically changes each team's strategy.

A trailing team will take more offensive risks, activate its defensemen and eventually pull its goalie. The leading team may protect the middle of the ice, sacrifice shot volume and look for counterattacks or an empty-net goal.

THIRD-PERIOD OVERS ARE MORE ATTRACTIVE WHEN:

- The game is separated by one or two goals.
- The trailing team has a strong offense.
- A goalie pull is likely.
- Both teams continue producing quality chances.
- The leading team is dangerous attacking an empty net.

THIRD-PERIOD UNDERS MAY HAVE VALUE WHEN:

- The game is tied and both teams become conservative.
- The leading team protects the slot effectively.
- Neither offense is generating quality chances.
- The score makes an early goalie pull unlikely.

Pregame third-period wagers are difficult because the future game state is unknown. In most cases, third-period markets are better approached live after evaluating the score, pace, penalties, shot quality and goaltending through 40 minutes.

Overtime is generally not included in third-period wagers. Period bets are normally settled using only the score during the specified period, but rules can vary by sportsbook. Review the posted house rules before betting.

WHICH HOCKEY MARKET IS BEST?

For beginning bettors, the recommended progression is: Full-game moneyline > first-period markets > team totals > full-game totals > puck lines > second- and third-period live betting.

The moneyline is the simplest place to begin. First-period markets can then provide opportunities involving fast starts, slow starts and strong goaltending without empty-net exposure. Full-game totals and puck lines require more experience because special teams, overtime and late-game strategy can change the result.

Second- and third-period wagers are usually more valuable as live bets because the bettor can evaluate how the game is actually unfolding.

BEST OVERALL HOCKEY BETTING TIPS

- Confirm both starting goalies before betting.
- Study five-on-five expected goals and high-danger chances.
- Account for back-to-backs, travel and accumulated fatigue.
- Review injuries by role, not merely by player name.
- Compare the price at multiple sportsbooks.
- Understand whether overtime and shootouts count.
- Use first-period markets when the early-game matchup is clearer than the full-game matchup.
- Prefer live second- and third-period bets when game state creates the opportunity.
- Avoid heavy juice unless your calculated advantage justifies it.
- Keep wagers consistent and never chase a loss.

The strongest hockey wager is not always the full-game winner. Sometimes the clearest edge is a first-period under, a second-period over, a third-period live total or an underdog on the puck line. The objective is to select the market that most directly reflects the advantage identified by your handicap.

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
